- Details of our learning in Phonics will be sent home and posted on Class Dojo every week this shows the sounds that we are learning, some of the words that we are reading, the sentences we will be writing and the spellings we're focusing on that week. You can help your child by reading and writing these words and sentences.
- Please provide your child with a PE kit inside a pump bag to be kept in school. Your child's PE kit should consist of blue shorts and a white t-shirt. Please pop your child's name in their PE kit.
- We have two brilliant after school clubs running this half-term. Dance on a Monday 3:15-4:15pm and Science club on a Tuesday 3:15-4:15pm. If you would like your child to take part, please do let us know and we can provide you with a letter. To pick your child up from an after school club, please come to the Main Entrance door (by the office) for 4:15pm.
