<p>If children are poorly with non COVID illness e.g. chicken pox</p>	<p>Children should stay at home and rest</p> <p>Child can access (if well enough):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reading Books • Spelling Zappers • Phonic Keyrings

<p>If children are well but self- isolating because their bubble/ school has closed.</p> <p>The first day or two of remote education may look different from our standard approach, this is while we take action to prepare for an extended period of remote learning.</p>	<p>Children will be required to stay at home.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Weekly learning plan will be emailed or shared via Class Dojo <p>Children can also access</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> •BBC Bitesize •Oak Academy Lessons •White Rose Maths Hub Resources • Daily staff video messages and stories <p>Staff will acknowledge children’s work and provide feedback throughout the school day.</p>
