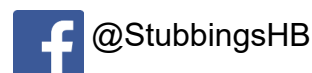

We are all very excited about our new topic 'The Great Fire of London'. We began by learning about London, we now know it is the capital city of England and can name many famous landmarks. This week we travelled back in time to 1666 to a rather different London. We compared objects from the past and present before cooking a traditional Tudor meal of pottage and bread. We loved the bread, but the pottage had mixed reviews! We finally found out about some jobs from 1666. Do you know what a gong farmer does? Well, they had the delightful job of emptying the privies and cess pits. Next week we will find out about the key events of the Great Fire and we can't wait!



Little Acorns

The children were excited to come back from the Easter break to find our classroom had completely changed! There is even a self-serve playdough station! There was much excitement as we discovered the home corner had 'moved house' and the areas were in different places. We are enjoying learning in the new quiet and noisy zones.

Our topic has got off to a great start. We have loved observing the tadpoles and can tell you about the changes we have noticed such as the tails and bodies getting longer. On Thursday our caterpillars arrived so we are so excited to be able to watch them grow and change.

We have read the Tiny seed by Eric Carle and learnt about the seeds in different fruits and vegetables. We cannot wait to compare the sunflowers, salad leaves, herbs and nasturtiums we have planted.

In the water we have been experimenting with floating and sinking and using pipettes and syringes to get our finger muscles strong and to sink the frogs and lily pads.

We have been enjoying exploring the secret garden, searching for mini-beasts, hiding in the trees, digging in the gravel and mud and doing some gardening!
