
We would like to say a huge well done to all the children who have been learning at home; you have all been superstars. We would also like to thank all the grown-ups who have supported them, we can see that you have



Can you guess what animals they created?


Little Acorns




Little Acorns have been enjoying looking really carefully at our picture to see what they can see.

step on the next stepping stone and get from the chair to the sofa without falling in the water!






This is how you can get involved with our World Book Day Celebrations on March 12th

Get creative and decorate a potato as a famous book character. Send us a photo of your character potato on Class Dojo or bring it into school on the 12th.






Find a prop that relates to a children's story e.g. wand, teapot, compass. Write some clues so we can guess the name of the character or story they belong to.
