There was great excitement when we found a message in a bottle and discovered our parrot was on a faraway island with Captain Blackbeard. We have completed challenges each day in order to rescue our parrot. We have been practising our mark making and writing by drawing and labelling treasure maps and pirate pictures. We have been practising our counting and number recognition by counting doubloons, going on number hunts and looking for the missing numbers. We have been practising our phase 3 digraphs by using our telescopes to hunt for 'ar words' around our room and then writing them onto our treasure maps.

We have been sorting treasure by different criteria to help the pirates. We have been counting doubloons and matching them to numbers so Captain Blackbeard knows how much money he has.

We have been experimenting with boat designs and exploring which materials will float and sink by walking the plank with objects and testing out our boat designs. Take a look!
